She was born 28 Nov 1821 in Honington, Warwick Co., England¹¹, and died 12 Mar 1889 in DeWitt, Onondaga Co., New York^{12,13}.

From the Syracuse Evening-Herald, 12 March 1886, p.4 [Fri.] - Surrogate's Court. Application was received for proof of the will of John Jones, late of DeWitt, and a citation was issued returnable on the 20th inst.

From the Syracuse Evening-Herald, 23 March 1886, p.4 [Tues.] - Surrogate's Court. Henry Jones received letters testamentary to the estate of John Jones, late of DeWitt, whose will was proved.

Last Will of John Jones, From Book No. 4 of Wills at page 396, recorded in Onondaga Co., New York

I, John Jones of the town of DeWitt, County of Onondaga and State of New York, being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament. First, I give, devise and bequeath to my dear wife Mary all my real estate of whatever name or nature of which I may die possessed, to have and to hold the same for her sole use and behoof for and during her natural life. Second, After the demise of my said wife I dispose of my said real estate as follows, viz: (a) I give devise and bequeath to my son Stephen, the thirty-two acres of land with the appurtenances, situated on the south side of my farm in said town of DeWitt being part of Lot Thirty-one (31) and the same property described in deed from Lucius A. Cheney & wife to John Jones dated February Fourteenth eighteen hundred and sixty, said 32 acres being south part of farm, I give the above described piece of land to my son Stephen on condition that he pay to my son Henry one thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) in five equal annual payments of two hundred Dollars each also under condition that he pay my son Charles on thousand dollars (\$1000.00) in the same manner (b) After the life estate as aforesaid of my said wife shall have terminated, I give, devise and bequeath to my sons Arthur and George the fifty acres with the appurtenances being the north part of my farm in said town of DeWitt said fifty acres being the same property described in a deed dated April first eighteen hundred and fifty-one from Lucius A. Cheney & wife to John Jones each of my said sons Arthur and George to take an undivided half of said fifty acre piece of land, I give said land to my sons Arthur and George as aforesaid under condition that they pay my son Franklin one thousand dollars in five equal annual payments of two hundred dollars each, also under the further condition that the said Arthur & George pay my daughter Sarah one thousand dollars in five equal annual payments of two hundred Dollars in five equal annual payments, The first payment above directed to be made by my son Stephen to my son Henry and the first payment above directed to be made by my sons Arthur and George to my son Franklin and to my daughter Sarah and to my daughter Annie are each respectively to be made one year after the demise of both myself and wife. Third, I give devise

and bequeath all my property both real and personal as above and hereinafter set forth to my above named eight children under the express condition that in one year after the decease of both myself and wife each and every one of my said children shall give and pay over to the Presbyterian church of East Syracuse the sum of forty Dollars making in all the sum of Three hundred and twenty Dollars. Fourth, I give and bequeath to my sons Arthur and George all farming implements in use or remaining on my farm and belonging to me at the time of my demise including horses and harnesses, machines and tools of whatever kind. Fifth, I give and bequeath all property real & personal of whatever name or nature of which I may die possessed except that above mentioned, to my said children share & share alike except the furniture and all the appurtenances of the house in which my wife and myself live at the time of my demise, which furniture and appurtenances, I give and bequeath to her, I make and constitute my son Henry my sole executor Dated this 16th day of October 1885, John Jones the forgoing instrument was at the date thereof subscribed by the said John Jones in our presence and he at the same time declared the same to be his last will and testament and requested us to sign our names as witnesses which we do in his presence and in the presence of each other, Isaac Swift, East Syracuse, N.Y. Wardwell Beach, DeWitt, N.Y. State of New York, County of Onondaga Surrogate's Office, SS, I George R. Cook, Surrogate of the County of Onondaga, New York, do hereby certify that the annexed instrument is a copy of the last will and testament of John Jones, late of the town of DeWitt, in said County of Onondaga, deceased, which said last will and testament was by an order and decree of the Surrogate's Court, as a will, valid, to pass both real and personal estate, That I have compared said copy with the original will now in my custody, and that the same is a true transcript therefrom and of the whole thereof. From the Syracuse Journal, 24 Feb. 1886 [Wed.] - VICINITY NEWS - East Syracuse. Deacon Jones died on Tuesday at his residence here. He was 67 years of age. His funeral will be held on Thursday at 1 p.m. at the Presbyterian Church.

From the Syracuse Evening Herald, 24 Feb. 1886, p.3 [Wed.] - East Syracuse, Feb.. 24. - John Jones, one of the old Presidents of the town of DeWitt, died yesterday morning, aged sixty-seven years. He was ill but a few days and died of heart disease. Mr. Jones had been connected with the Presbyterian church since its organization in 1876, having been previously a member of the church at Collamer. During this time he served faithfully in the offices of ruling elder and church trustee. The funeral will be held at the house at 1 P.M. and at the church at 2 P.M. tomorrow.

From the Syracuse Evening Herald, 26 Feb. 1886, p.3 [Fri.] - East Syracuse - The funeral of John Jones yesterday was largely attended. The Rev. Isaac Swift preached the sermon. The body was buried at Messina Springs.

A Verified Transcript From The Register of Deaths, Register No. Bk 15-16

The Jones family of this pedigree (as of this writing) can be traced back to 18th Century England and the County of Warwickshire. Little is known of the patriarch of the family, William Jones, husband to Ann, however, two children from this union have been documented, John, the Great-Great-Grandfather of the author, b. March 12, 1819, in Brailes, Warwick Co., England and Mary, b. 1821.

John Jones was married to Mary Ann Katherine Spencer on November 27, 1843, in Honington, Warwick Co., daughter of Richard Spencer and Sarah Hiatt. Sometime around 1850, John and Mary, along with Mary's father Richard Spencer, immigrated to the United States, settling in Onondaga Co., New York, probably in the town of DeWitt where deeds and census records have documented them.

Children of John and Mary Jones, especially the males, worked the family land and raised cattle. Deeds on file at the Onondaga County Clerk's office, show property was owned in East Syracuse/DeWitt and Jamesville, with the author's Great-Grandfather, Benjamin Franklin (Frank), owning a wholesale slaughter house at 512 S. Clinton Street in the meat packing district of Downtown Syracuse. While I do not have copies of business receipts, it is safe to assume that cattle was supplied to Frank's business from the family owned cattle farm. This was short lived as the "Great Rift," as I call it, that took place between Frank and his brother George and Stephen, would drive a wedge between them, one that would eventually divide the family for ever. This "Great Rift," took place when terms of their father's will were either ignored by George and Stephen or impossible to meet. Essentially, John's will gave the family property (farm) in East Syracuse to George and Stephen, who were to pay Frank a specific amount of money after five years. For whatever reason, these terms were not met and Frank reposed the

land, dividing the family. After this rift, and to this day, there is no evidence that the family ever had contact again; even to the extent that Frank is not mentioned as a brother in George's will.

Henry Jones & Wife oc. to Franklin Jones - This Indenture, made this 10 day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety six Between Henry Jones and Lena Jones, his wife by occupation a carpenter; Arthur Jones and Carrie his wife, George Jones (unmarried) by occupations farmers, and Sarah Miller, all of the Town of DeWitt, Onondaga County New York, and Anna Greenway residing in the Town of Onondaga County & State aforesaid of the first part, and Franklin Jones of Syracuse, N.Y. by occupation Manager of Dold Co. of the second part all being the children and heirs at law of John Jones deceased, Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part in consideration of the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, to them in hand paid by the said parties of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged have bargained, sold, remised and ? claimed and by these presents, do bargain, sell, remise and quit claim unto the said party of the second part and to his heirs and assign forever, all the right title and interest which each of said first parties respectively has in and to the following described from use to wit: All that certain piece and parcel of land being part of Lot Number Thirty One of the original township of Manlius (now DeWitt) bounded and described as follows: to wit: Beginning at the northwest corner of said lot running thence south along the west line of said lot, nineteen chains and ninety eight links; thence east parallel to the north line of said lot twenty five chains and two and one half links; thence north parallel to the west line of said lot nineteen chains and ninety eight links to the north line of said lot; thence west along said north line twenty five chains and two and one half links to the place of beginning, containing fifty acres of land, This deed is given in consequence of the failure of Arthur Jones and George Jones, to whom the above described premises were devised by the last will and testament of John Jones, late of the Town of DeWitt, deceased to perform on their part, the conditions precedent in posect (?) from them by the terms of said will which was made and executed October 16, 1885, probated March 2, 1886, and recorded in the office of the Clerk of Onondaga County, March 22, 1886, in Book No. 4 of Wills at page 396, all matters pertaining to said estate which in anyway affect the said premises above described have been adjusted and settled by the party of the second part hereto and all heirs and encumbrances thereon hereby cancelled, paid and satisfied, Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anyway appertaining, and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof, and all the estate right title, interest, claim and demand whatsoever, of the said parties of the first part either in law or equity of, in, or to the above bargained premises with the said hereditaments and appurtenances, to have and to hold the said described lands and premises to the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, to the sole and only proper benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, In Witness Whereof the parties of the first part have hereunto their hands and seals the day and year first above written, Henry Jones (w) Lena her x-mark Jones (w) Arthur Jones (w) Carrie Jones (w) George Jones (w) Sarah A. All or part of the land acquired by Frank Jones, upon default of his brothers to pay the sum requested by their father's will, appears to have been returned by Mary J. Jones, wife of Frank, in the year Frank died.

Jones was found Tuesday in a hayloft in a barn near Jones' slaughter house on the Jamesville road. Dr. B.W. Sherwood thought the man was suffering with apoplexy and ordered him taken to the Hospital of the Good Shepherd. Here Jones was unconscious until 11:30 Thursday night, when he died. Coroner Kinne was called, but as he was not in Coroner's Physician Babcock was drafted into service. He held an autopsy this morning, but other than that the man died from a fractured skull, and that it is a suspicious case and was up to the officers to investigate, he would not say anything for fear it might hinder the officers in getting clues [sic].

From the Syracuse Post Standard, 25 June 1910, p.7 [Sat.] - FRACTURED SKULL CAUSED BY FALL, CORONER SAYS: No Evidence of Foul Play Is Found in Case of George Jones, Found Dying in Barn at Jamesville Tuesday. After an investigation yesterday Coroner George R. Kinne and Deputy

Sheriff John C. Kratz concluded that George Jones of this city fractured his skull Monday night by falling from a ladder in a barn near Jamesville. He was found Tuesday morning in the barn, unconscious. There were no marks indicating any injuries and it was thought he had suffered a stroke of apoplexy. Dr. B.W. Sherwood sent him to the Hospital of the Good Shepherd Tuesday morning and his death occurred at the hospital Thursday night. A post-mortem yesterday, under direction of Coroner's Physician Archer D. Babcock, showed a fracture at the base of the skull. This led to the investigation by the Coroner and deputy sheriff. Coroner Kinne said last night: "We found there was a straight ladder extending to the hayloft. A nephew was the last man who saw Mr. Jones before the latter was found in the barn, and when the nephew saw him he was going towards the barn. There were no exterior marks of any consequence to indicate that he might have been injured or assaulted, and the fracture being at the base led us to believe it was caused by a fall. Mr. Kratz found that Mr. Jones had not had a quarrel with anyone and there had been no cause for any assault. Mr. Jones was 45 years old and is survived by a sister, Mrs. Victor Miller, and three brothers, Charles, Stephen and Arthur, all of East Syracuse. The funeral will be held at the home of Mrs. Miller, No. 235 Kinne street, East Syracuse, at 2:30 o'clock to-morrow afternoon. Burial will be at Collamer.

From the Syracuse Journal, 25 June 1910, p.4 [Sat.] - In Corner of Pig Sty Loft, Unfit for Habitation, Friends Find Man, Irrational, With Fractured Skull - Autopsy at Hospital of Good Shepherd, Where George Jones Died, Shows Broken Head and Coroner Holds That Death Was Due to Accidental Fall From Ladder Foul Play Hinted At. [From photograph showing filthy surroundings where George Jones was found]. In a place unfit for human habitation, George Jones, now dead, was found irrational with a fractured skull. It was in a filthy corner of the upper part of a pig pen connected with Jones' slaughter house on the Jamesville road, near Rock Cut. It was thought Jones was a victim of foul play. Coroner's Findings. Coroner Kinne says death was due to accidental fall from ladder. His skull was fractured by the fall, the Coroner holds. The place in which Jones spent his three days in pain over the pig pen was one of dramatic setting and it scented of the suggested foul play in the case. It is a climb of 10 feet from the pig pen below and in the corner where Jones made his home the floor is littered with old, ill-smelling clothing of all kinds, a remnant of a bedtick and scrapes of paper. Here and there are scattered empty whiskey bottles. In the heat of the afternoon sun, which shone through the cracks of the old building, hugh horseflies buzzed around the bed of the sick man and through the floor came the grunts of the pigs below. While it was said that the other members of the Jones family slept and lived in a more respectable looking building a few yards away, no reasons were given why George Jones slept alone above the pigs. Came to Syracuse - Jones came to Syracuse Saturday, a week ago, with a load of dressed beef, accompanied by his nephew, Frank Jones, of the firm of Jones Brothers of the slaughter house. Frank Jones could not be found. His brother, Howard Jones, said that his uncle had not been in a fight, nor had he had an accident. According to his story, the man now dead returned from the city and Saturday night climbed to the upper part of the pig pen and went to "bed." The young man said that Sunday, when George did not put in an appearance, men from the slaughter house climbed into the loft and found Jones in pain. He was found Monday and Tuesday an ambulance and Dr. B.W. Sherwood were summoned and, as soon as possible, Jones was gotten to the Hospital of the Good Shepherd. The people in the neighborhood were led to believe that Jones had suffered sunstroke and demanded to know how sunstroke could come on at night. Frank Jones' Stories - Frank Jones told a man in Stowell's place that his nephew [sic] fell from a wagon, and at the toll gate nearby he told John Middleton, who conducts the gate, that his nephew [sic] fell from a ladder.

Several were called as witnesses before an adjournment was taken until Wednesday. Jones, his son declared, had been failing since an accident last year when he was thrown from a wagon and injured his head. It was claimed the retired butcher is susceptible to influence and that a deed to property valued at several thousand dollars has been turned over to Mrs. Smith since her father moved to her home. Whether the change of residence was voluntary on Jones' part was one of the questions that was bitterly disputed yesterday. Neighbors of Jones' son were summoned by James F. Ray of Wells, O'Brien & Ray counsel in the son's application for appointment of a committee and claimed Mrs. Smith helped her father into an automobile and he was heard to protest against leaving East Syracuse. Jones' answer to the move for a conservator of his property was filed by Edward F. Shea of Shea & Crimmins and said the retired butcher was anxious to make adequate provision for his daughter and that was the reason for the deed. It was said Jones had given his son the equivalent of \$8,000 in the past few years.

From the Syracuse Journal, 4 Aug. 1923, p.16 [Sat.] - ASKS FATHER BE DECLARED INCOMPETENT - Burton Jones Says Older Man Induced to Leave East Syracuse. Charges that Charles Jones, retired East Syracuse marketman, was induced against his will to leave East Syracuse and go to the home of his daughter, Mrs. Ray Smith, Williamstown, Oswego County, were made by Burton Jones, a son, in a proceeding which he instituted to have his father declared an incompetent person the first hearing in which was held before John W. He asserts that since the accident, the father has been easily influenced and that the daughter has obtained several thousand dollars of his property. The daughter denies this, claiming that the son has received \$8,000 from his father and that he is seeking to get complete charge of it. James F. Ray of Wells, O'Brien & Ray, represents the son. Edward F. Shea, of Shea & Crimmins has been retained by Jones and his daughter.

Burton L. Jones, son, sought appointment of a committee to manage his father's property. Jones fought the proceeding and appeared as a witness before the jury yesterday afternoon. "To think I have a son who would do what he is trying to do to me - his poor, crippled and almost blind father," Jones yesterday denounced his son. Mrs. Roy Smith of Williamstown, Oswego county, daughter of Jones, received a deed from him to East Syracuse real estate a short time before the proceedings were started by her brother.

Search for the missing trio started early yesterday morning after Jones, who had arranged for a train to stop at Sabattis Station Wednesday noon, failed to meet the train. Jones had shot a deer and was to have started for home with the animal Wednesday. James Premo, station agent at Sabattis, notified Corp. J.J. Wasilus of the Long Lake Patrol, State Police, and early yesterday Corporal Wasilus with Trooper Edward Cook and Game Protector John Lamos, organized searching parties. A man giving his name as Thomas Smith of Syracuse, member of another hunting party, who had joined the searchers, found the overturned boat yesterday shortly after noon. The boat was marooned in some sheet ice that formed over the pond Wednesday. Other hunters from camps in the Mud River section, where Jones had been staying, identified the boat as one which Jones, Riordan and Fancher had been using to transport hunting parties this fall. It is a small boat propelled by an outboard motor. Heavy-snow, which fell Wednesday night and all day yesterday, and low temperatures causing several inches of ice to form on still water streams and rivers of the section, hampered the work of searchers today, particularly the dragging operations supervised by Corporal Wasilus. Ice, almost an inch thick today, covered the pond. On the snow-covered bank of the pond were evidences of a struggle, as if the three heavily clad hunters had tried to drag themselves out of the cold water. Persons living in the vicinity told searchers that on Wednesday night they heard cries from the direction of the pond. There was a heavy snowfall on the mountains. Jones, for many years, has passed summers and fall seasons in the Long Lake section fishing and trapping in summer months, hunting and guiding hunting parties in the fall. Fancher is a year-around resident of the Adirondacks, living in Tupper Lake village winters and moving about in various nearby wooded sections in open weather. Fancher's camp is located about a mile from the one in which Jones had been living this fall. Riordan is believed to have been living with Fancher. Both camps were found locked and apparently unoccupied for at least 48 hours when troopers visited them yesterday. William Riordan of Saranac Lake, brother of the missing Frank Riordan, today left for Long Lake to aid the searching party.

Jones Was Expected Home During Week - John A. Jones, 37, of 4300 James Street, East, in the Town of Dewitt, was expected to come home this week, his mother Mrs. Carrie Jones, told East Syracuse police today. Jones have been living apart in obedience to the terms of a separation agreement, under which she receives \$2,600 and the custody of her youngest son, Irving Victor Jones. Jones now questions his wife's conduct during that period and has commenced a divorce suit against her in which he stamps her as being guilty of indiscretions since their parting. Insistent in her claim that she is being unjustly accused by her husband, Mrs. Jones makes a sweeping denial of the charges of misconduct and made application to Justice William M. Ross in Special Term on Saturday for alimony and counsel fees. The argument was set down for Nov. 6, when her plea will be heard for a sufficient allowance to enable her to defend her good name. Jones conducts a lucrative business in East Syracuse and is the owner of several valuable pieces of property. When the couple decide in March, 1913, that they had reached the parting of the ways they met in the offices of a local attorney. The separation agreement was drawn up and signed and the signatures witnessed by Mrs. Florence M. Ramsden, who was shot and killed by her husband in Anderson Park at Rochester last year. The separation agreement provided that Mrs. Jones was to forfeit her interest in her husband's property upon the payment of \$2,600. While she was given the baby and bound herself to make a will in favor of the child, the husband received the custody of the two other children, Earl Leonard Jones and Howard Roy Jones. For two years the couple obeyed the terms of the agreement to the letter. The past summer saw the filing of the divorce suit by Jones in which he made several charges of misconduct, which were immediately denied by the wife. In her demand for alimony, Mrs. Jones figures her husband's income at \$2,000 a year. While she says that she the \$2,600 she received from him two year and a half ago has aided her materially in providing for her son, she says that she has been forced to work. Ill health during the past few months has prevented her from holding a position and she now needs money to fight her husband's divorce action. Attracted by the odor of gas, Mrs. Shane went to the bathroom upon her return home and discovered her husband's body. She notified a neighbor, John J. O'Brien of 116 Barnes Avenue, and the latter called police. Shane was pronounced dead by an Onondaga General Hospital interne. Summoned to the scene from a dinner at the Onondaga Hotel, Coroner Gak said the man had been dead for two hours. Surviving Shane besides his wife, son and brother, are two daughters, Miss Martha Shane and Mrs. Marian Messer, and two sisters, Mrs. V.A. Simons and Miss Anna Shane of Syracuse. Pulaski, March 18. - Mrs. Herbert S. Dean of the western section of this town has received a letter from her son, Private Perl S. Jones, a native of Syracuse, who a few weeks ago went overseas. He tells of his arrival in France and says he is located on the banks of a creek in a small village. The trip was a pleasant one, entirely devoid of any alarming incident, and he greatly enjoyed it. Young men are seldom seen in the little French village where Private Jones and other Sammies are stationed; they have joined the colors. Nearly all of the elderly residents are in mourning. Every courtesy is extended the soldiers stationed at that point by the people of the little village. The young Pulaski soldier also writes that he is enjoying the best of health, that he lives the service, and he speaks in high terms of praise of the great work being done by the Red Cross and the Y.M.C.A. He was with the second contingent of registrants which last September left Pulaski for Camp Dix, Wrightsytown, N.J. Private Jones is a son of the late Frank Jones, who for a number of years conducted a meat market in Syracuse with a residence at 205 Furman st. Several years ago his widow was married to Herbert S. Dean, who lives on a farm a few miles west of this village. Another Pulaski man with the American expeditionary forces in France is Corporal Frederick Gates Mahaffy, son of Mrs. E. Morgan Jones of Park st., who also left here with the second contingent for Camp Dix.

From the Syracuse Herald, 12 July 1920, p.6 [Mon.] - ARRESTED FOR SELLING AUTO. Police Say Jones Bought Car in California on Installments. In ill health and nearly out of funds, 3,000 miles from home, Perl S. Jones of Fayetteville sold an automobile which he had purchased on the installment plan in Los Angeles, Calif., and with the money so secured paid his wife's railroad fare back east, police charge. As a result he was arrested in Fayetteville Sunday by Detective Edward J. Smith and is being held pending the arrival of a Los Angeles detective who will take him to California for trial. Jones is a veteran of the world war, he says, and returned from it broken in health. Last June he decided to go to Southern California where he believed the climate might restore him. Arriving there, however, his health failed to improve, and he and his wife wished to return. Their funds being several hundred dollars less than the money needed for traveling expenses Jones, police allege, bought an automobile on a payment of \$125 down and an agreement to pay \$40 weekly until the full price was paid, drove the car to Salt Lake City and sold it there for \$550. With this money he and Mrs. Jones came home.

From the Syracuse Herald, 24 July 1920, p.3 [Sat.] - LOS ANGELES SHERIFF LOSES HIS PRISONER. Perl S. Jones Escapes Moving Train at Syracuse Station. SLIPS OUT SIDE DOOR. Deputy Carried to Rochester When Conductor Refuses to Stop Express. Perl S. Jones, 27, Fayetteville war veteran, escaped from the custody of a California deputy sheriff shortly after midnight as he boarded a train here enroute for Los Angeles, where he is under indictment for the theft of an automobile. Jones entered a Pullman sleeper by one door, and escaped through another as the train started. Some time elapsed before the escape was discovered, and the deputy was carried to Rochester without his prisoner. News that Jones was at large was not received by the local authorities until daybreak, and by that hour all trace of the prisoner had been lost. He was still missing in the late afternoon. Jones was arrested at his home in Fayetteville by Detective Edward J. Smith July 11 on a warrant issued at Los Angeles charging grand larceny, second degree. He had admitted to local police, they say, the charge against him. In Poor Health. According to Jones's story to Detective Sidney J. Dillon, he had been in poor health since his discharge from the army. He served two years with the first division in France, and contracted a lingering illness. With his wife he went to California last fall in the hope of recovering. In the spring, Jones said, he decided to return East, but lacking the necessary funds. With the idea of attempting to drive across the continent, he purchased an automobile on the installment plan. The car was valued at \$1,500. Jones paid \$200 down and agreed to pay the balance in monthly installments. With his wife, Jones drove the car to Salt Lake City, Utah. There, he admits the police say, he sold the auto to a second used-car dealer for \$550. With this money he and his wife came home by railroad. Traced by Police. They had been in Fayetteville less than a month when the California authorities traced them, and Jones's arrest followed. On a fugitive from justice warrant sworn out by Chief Cadin, Jones was committed to the Onondaga penitentiary, and Deputy Sheriff George C. Blasdell was sent across the continent to bring Jones back to Los Angeles. Blasdell and his prisoner started at midnight. Blasdell purchased

Pullman reservations on the 12:30 A.M. (railroad time) express over the New York Central. Sheriff Edward G. Ten Eyck accompanied them to the train shed. Just as the train started Blasdell swung his prisoner aboard along with Blasdell's traveling bag. The deputy paused a few moments to bid Sheriff Ten Eyck good-bye, and then followed. Drops From Train. In the meantime, Jones had dropped the deputy's bag in the car aisle, had opened the vestibule door on the opposite side, and had dropped from the slowly moving train. By the time Blasdell had searched the car and questioned the conductor and porter the train was well beyond Solvay. The conductor refused to stop and Blasdell was carried to Rochester, from where he telegraphed the first word known locally of the escape. Subsequent investigation has shown that Jones's wife gave up the house in Fayetteville and had left the village last Tuesday. No one could be found who had seen her since. This is the only fact which leads the police to believe that Jones's escape was premeditated. Detective Smith has been assigned by Chief Cadin to aid Deputy Blasdell in the recapture of his prisoner. When he escaped Jones was wearing a blue serge suit, blue necktie, round fedora hat and tan shoes. There are two easily seen scars on his face, one over each eye, the result of burns received while working at the Precision Casting company, just previous to his arrest.

From the Syracuse Herald, 25 July 1920, p.6 [Mon.] - HUNT FUGITIVE NEAR PULASKI - Police Hear Man Who Eluded California Sheriff Has Visited, Mother. That Perl S. Jones, fugitive from California authorities, following his sensational escape Friday at midnight from a deputy sheriff taking him aboard a train at the Central New York station is somewhere in Central New York, is the theory suggested to authorities engaged today in circulating [sic] him for nationwide search. The theory gets strength from the report that he has been seen near Pulaski, his home before he joined the A.E.F., and the home of his mother now. It is bolstered further by the growing certainty that his escape was according to carefully laid plans. Wife Left Home Before Escape. The wife of the young veteran indicted in California for sale of an auto bought on an unfulfilled contract left her home in Fayetteville several days before her husband's escape and has not been seen since. It is believed someone made ready a hiding place for the fugitive. Jones walked out the other side of a vestibule coach when put aboard on the platform side by Deputy Sheriff Blasdell of Los Angeles. It is the current belief that he was not walking out without knowing where he was going. He had gained the confidence of his guard by pledging himself to give no trouble. He was not handcuffed. Father Manlius Butcher, Dead. The youth is the son of a Manlius butcher, who died ten years ago. The widow lives on a farm near Pulaski. Close investigation by the sheriff's office of reports that two agents sought Mrs. Perl S. Jones at Fayetteville after she left there Tuesday has turned up nothing more. It was at first reported that these men represented a Rochester automobile concern defrauded on an automobile sale contract. This gave rise to the theory that the Joneses might be making a livelihood by defaulting in the fashion that caused the husband's arrest.

From the Syracuse Herald, 31 July 1920, p.3 [Sat.] - ESCAPED PRISONER CAPTURED IN BUFFALO IS BROUGHT HERE. PERL S. JONES, FUGITIVE FROM JUSTICE CAUGHT IN BUFFALO ROOMING HOUSE, POLICE SAY. War Veteran Who Made Sensational Escape From California Sheriff Is Being Returned to Onondaga Penitentiary. GOVERNOR'S WARRANT WILL CAUSE VETERAN'S RETURN TO THE WEST. Perl S. Jones, Pulaski and Fayetteville war veteran and fugitive from justice, who made a sensational escape from the custody of a deputy sheriff boarding a train for California with him a week ago in the Syracuse Central train shed, has been caught according to advices from the Buffalo police. The prisoner taken started for Syracuse this morning in the custody of two police officials, representing the Onondaga county sheriff's office. The arrest made in Buffalo, made in the Prospect avenue rooming house section, was by authority of a governor's warrant from California. The writ was left there by Deputy Sheriff Blasdell from whom Jones escaped. The charge against Jones is that he sold an automobile bought on contract while the contract was unfulfilled. Originally detained at Onondaga penitentiary pending arrival of a police officer and a warrant from California, the man, found living with his wife at Fayetteville, was so docile that the authorities placed every confidence in him. Fayetteville residents signed a petition requesting California authorities to exercise clemency in case of conviction. The California deputy sheriff had assurance that his prisoner would occasion him no trouble. When they went to board a midnight train westbound a week ago, Thursday, the prisoner was not handcuffed. Allowed to board the train first he opened the door on the opposite side of the vestibule and walked away free. Deputy Sheriff Blasdell went to Buffalo early in the week. There it was believed Mrs. Jones had relatives. She had quit her Fayetteville home several days before her husband's escape. The arrest was made following surveillance of the Heffron home in Fayetteville, where Mrs. Luella Heffron Jones, the fugitive's wife, was expected to return. The Onondaga authorities had information that the Joneses had money in the bank here. Perl Jones had only \$10 on his person when he escaped. Deputy Sheriff George Ten Eyck and Tom Burns Friday night followed to Buffalo two women, one described as Mrs. Jones. They had visited the Heffron home and motored to the city, afterward boarding the 11 o'clock train West. At Buffalo city officials, warned by Sheriff Ten Eyck and Deputy Sheriff Hoffmire, were waiting for the party to take up the trail here. The Buffalo police said at noon the prisoner admitted his identity.

From the Syracuse Herald, 1 Aug. 1920, p.1 [Sun.] [photo] - Jones Arrested in Buffalo as He Was About to Leave for West. PERL S. JONES BROUGHT BACK FROM BUFFALO. Prisoner Who Escaped From California Sheriff Arrested Following Clever Work by Syracuse Detectives. SORRY HE MADE HIS GET-AWAY, HE TELLS. Police Followed Wife on Train and Caught Man Just in the Nick of Time. Perl S. Jones, 27 year old world war veteran, who escaped from the custody of Deputy Sheriff Blasdell of Los Angeles, Calif., while boarding the train for the West with him a week ago, was brought back to Syracuse at 3:20 o'clock on Saturday afternoon from Buffalo by George Ten Eyck and Thomas Burns, deputy sheriffs. Jones declared that if the deputies had not caught him when they did, he would have been on his way to California to give himself up on the charge of stealing an automobile for which he was extradited. The Syracuse men went to Buffalo last night after a week of sleuthing that would have done credit to detectives of fiction. Mrs. Luella Jones, wife of the fugitive, made her home when in this part of the world with her mother, Mrs. Mary Heffron of Fayetteville. Last Monday night Sheriff Ten Eyck and Criminal Deputy Sheriff Hoffmire, accompanied by Deputy Sheriff Blasdell....and were told by Mrs. Heffron that her daughter had left there five or six days earlier after having bidden her a farewell which she said would be eternal. Bids Mother Goodbye. "She put her arms around my neck," said Mrs. Heffron, "and said; Mother, I am going far away and I don't suppose that I shall ever see you again. But that we will meet in heaven, God bless you." Mrs. Heffron told the officers that her daughter had about \$400 in one of the banks here and that she knew that Luella had not drawn it out before leaving town. From that the sheriff's force suspected that the young wife would return for more money, as Perl had with him only \$10.20 when he was arrested here and had spent some of that before he started for Los Angeles. From that time on the Heffron place was shadowed by deputy sheriffs in disguise, who were hidden at vantage points from which they could watch the house on all sides. On Friday morning they reported to Sheriff Ten Eyck that Mrs. Jones, with another young woman, had come to the house in an automobile. At dark Friday night Sheriff Ten Eyck, Criminal Deputy Sheriff Hoffmire, with Deputies George Ten Eyck and Thomas Burns stationed themselves in an automobile near the Heffron home and waited developments [sic.]. About 9 o'clock a car drove up by the door and Mrs. Jones and another young woman came out of the house and got in the car. Officers Followed. The officers followed them into the city and to the Postal Telegraph office, where the other woman got off and sent a wire. From there they were driven to the electric terminal, where they made inquiries in regard to the Rochester cars and were informed that none ran further than Newark that night. They were driven to the New York Central station and the car stopped a little west of the Fayette street entrance, where Mrs. Jones got off. closely shadowed by Deputy Ten Eyck. She bought two tickets for Buffalo. Then she got into the car again and was driven a little past the entrance to the Howard hotel and at about 11 o'clock, New York State time, went into the train shed, boarding the 11:05 train for the west. Deputies Burns and Ten Eyck got on the train with them. Mr. Hoffmire telephoned the office of the chief of police at Buffalo, asking that detectives should be sent to the station to meet the Syracuse men and to shadow the women so that they should not be lost sight of. Detectives at Station. When the train reached Buffalo Detectives E.J. Newton and John Floor were at the station in a hack. The women were evidently expected for an automobile was there to meet them, and if the Buffalo policemen had not had a car, the Syracusans would have missed their quarry for at that hour of the morning not a taxi was in sight. Hastily climbing into the car, the officers drove off. The car which they were trailing stopped at 70 Prospect street and the other woman got out.. Detective Floor and Deputy Burns got out after her in the shadow and the other motor followed the car which held Mrs. Jones. After a drive of about four blocks, she got off, ran up the steps of a house and tapped on the window. The door was opened by Jones. George Ten Eyck stepped out of the shadow, "Hello, Jonesey," he said. The fugitive stared for a minute - then his lips parted in a broad grin. "Got Here, Didn't You?" "Why, hello, George," she said, "Got here, didn't you?" Mrs. Jones promptly fell forward in a faint. If Detective Newton had not caught her, she would have slid all the way down the flight of steps. "I'm not sorry you've come," said Jones to the detective. "This hiding away all the time is pretty hard work. I'd rather go back and take my medicine." Mrs. Jones passed from swoon, to swoon. The women in the rooming house with the help of physicians worked over her all night. Once she recovered consciousness sufficient to break into sobs and cry out: "Oh, Perl, my poor boy, I'll never see you again." "Oh, yes you will babe," replied the captive cheerfully. "Now, be brave. "But if it hadn't been for those calamity hounds at the pen I never would have tried it. They kept saying to me: "Oh, for God's sake if you have a chance to make a break, do it. You've never been in trouble before. You don't know what is in store for you when you get back to California. You'll wish you were dead a hundred times before they get through with you. "But honest, I didn't think of it until we got on the train. Then as Blasdell was shaking hands with George Ten Eyck, I just opened the door on the other side of him and stepped off. I didn't run or hurry nor draw any attention to myself. I walked over to the corner of Franklin and Walton streets, caught a Solvay car and got the first trolley for Rochester. I changed and went through Lockport and back

to Buffalo. " Luella was working at Silver Bay. I got in touch with her and she came over. I asked her what she thought about things - by that time I was sorry I had escaped - and she said she'd go back to Syracuse and talk to a lawyer. Would Get Caught. "I'm not going to tell you who the lawyer was, but he told her that the only sensible thing to do was to go to Los Angeles and give myself up. He said I'd surely get caught sooner or later and that then it would go harder with me. Luella came back to Buffalo and told me. "And I knew she was right. Syracuse was my home. It would have been hard, if not impossible, for me to keep away from there forever and most people know me there. So we decided that Luella should come home, draw her money out of the bank and we would get on the road to California as soon as we could. And if the detectives hadn't come until this morning, you wouldn't have found us. "I'm ready for whatever happens. We'll take what money we have and pay for that car as far as we can. Whatever they do to me, I'll have to stand it. But I want to tell you that I'm not a bit sorry I was caught, except that I would have liked to go back by myself. " Just fancy the look of Blasdell's face if I had walked into the sheriff's office at Los Angeles! It would have been worth seeing - don't you think so?" Jones is a good looking young fellow with a frank, boyish manner. He and his wife eloped eight years ago when she was 17 and he was 19 years old.

A post card from Los Angeles, Calif., addressed to Sheriff Ten Eyck in the handwriting of Mrs. Luella H. Jones, wife of Perl S. Jones, was received at the sheriff's office Wednesday. The card bore no message and its object evidently was to let the county authorities know that the young woman had arrived in Los Angeles, the city for which she started on the day following her husband's arrest by Deputy Sheriffs Burns and George Ten Eyck in Buffalo. Mrs. Jones had with her about \$600, which she said she was going to offer in payment for the car purchased and sold by him later in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Three former employes of the Fayetteville plant of the Precision Casting Company, Inc., testified in the Federal Building Tuesday as the National Labor Relations Board continued its hearing into charges that the company dismissed 24 employes for union activities in 1935. Former workers who testified Tuesday were Francis Deery, Harry Wilbur and his son, Merwin Wilbur. They testified their names were a list of 24 names placed on the company's bulletin board stating they were discharged. The hearing was continued Tuesday afternoon by W.P. Webb of Washington, examiner for the labor board. H. Duane Bruce is attorney for the company, and Peter J. Crotty of Buffalo is counsel for the Labor Board. Four employes, Leo Nash, Perl Jones and Earl Mills, now residents of Cleveland, O., and Thomas Ganley of Syracuse, testified Monday afternoon they were fired because of their activities as members of Local 80, international Molders' Union of North America. Jones testified he was requested by Milton Bex, plant foreman to turn in his union card and discontinue affiliation with the local. Mills and Ganley testified they had never been laid off for extended periods before their dismissal. J.W. Knapp, vice president of the company, contended the firm is not engaged in interstate commerce and therefore is not subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Labor Board. He testified that the company buys some of its raw materials in other states. The Precision Company contends that the 24 men were discharged because of lack of business while the Labor Board charges they were discriminated against between July 26 and Aug. 14, 1935, for their union affiliations.

MORRISVILLE, Oct. 19. - In Supreme Court to-day the case of Luella Heffron of the town of Sullivan against the Central Railroad Company was concluded. The plaintiff, a young woman of 18 years, went to Canastota with her brother and two young friends on July 4, 1908, to witness the celebration. About 9 o'clock in the evening the party started for the station to take a cara back home, and in hurrying across the grass plot on the defendant company's premises the plaintiff was thrown violently to the ground by a wire stretched across an opening in the shrubbery and, it was alleged, received serious injuries, from which she still suffers. The defendant claimed there was no negligence on its part and that the accident was the result of the plaintiff's own negligence in turning aside from the walk provided by the defendant to reach the station platform. The jury returned a verdict of \$3,000 in favor of the plaintiff.

Am feeling a little better now and so glad to be out of that hospital, although the doctors and nurses were all very kind to me. I had to have special nurses and for a while there things were pretty critical. The operation itself doesn't bother me - it's trying to get rid of the toxic poisons and getting the blood pressure down that makes it so hard. I understand that it take quite a while and that rest and quiet are the best thing for it. I never even suspected I had toxemia, as the doctor never told me and I didn't know that it sometimes showed itself in a continuously rising blood pressure - so it was quite a shock when they sent me to the hospital. My vision is about back to normal now for which I am glad - things were blurred for about a month after the operation and I understand some people have gone blind from high blood pressure. The baby was due just at this time - which happen to be "National Baby Week" - ironic isn't it? It takes a long while to get over things like that. No, I don't intend to go to Rochester when Jean has her baby, as it would only be a form of self-torture. Besides they never sent me a card or note when I was ill - in fact I never heard from any of my family. As far as receiving any flowers or anything from them would have been too much to expect. What a snide bunch they are! I sent Jean some baby clothes through Lyle. They really belong to another generation anyhow - and I never could see eye to eye with them. Russ has been very devoted and wonderful to me all the way through it. He sure is a wonderful guy! He says he sees young Ray down to the station about every day and likes him very much - thinks he is a very nice looking fellow. Will try to drive up to see you sometime when I am feeling stronger. Love Florimel
